SCOPE AND PURPOSE

Purpose of the License

The Preliminary School Counselor License is issued to qualified individuals who hold at least a master's degree in counseling, education, or related behavior sciences and have completed an initial school counselor preparation program.

Assignment Authorization

The Preliminary School Counselor License qualifies the holder to accept:

- Any assignment to serve as a school counselor from prekindergarten through grade 12 within Oregon public school districts, ESDs, or public charter schools
- Any substitute counseling assignments and
- Any substitute teaching assignments.

WHAT DO I NEED TO RENEW THIS LICENSE OR APPLY FOR MY NEXT LICENSE?

Apply for your next license approximately 90 days prior to your expiration date. Failure to meet renewal requirements and submit the required application and fee prior to the expiration date may result in late fees, loss of licensure and related employment.

This license may be renewed with 75 Professional Development Units (PDUs) earned during the term of this license.

To renew the Preliminary School Counselor License, you must:

- Submit an application and fee through eLicensing
- If employed in Oregon, then contact your school district(s). They will submit a PEER form to TSPC to verify your experience and assignment(s)
- Provide PDU verification either as part of your PEER submitted by your district to TSPC or as directed on the PDU: Continuing and Advanced page (www.oregon.gov/tspc/Pages/PDUs-Continuing.aspx) of our website

The Preliminary School Counselor License may be upgraded to the optional Professional School Counselor License. To be eligible you must apply and meet the school counselor experience requirement and the advanced school counselor competency requirement. Both requirements must be completed after your first license was obtained and beyond your initial school counselor preparation program.
